Project SITE focuses on deepening relationship to place. Beginning with guiding questions, we invite investigation that can illuminate the historical, cultural, and contemporary cadences situated within public spaces. In creating site specific responses for nontraditional settings, we explore how significant public sites resonate with our daily lives.

The HARBOURING Project aims to deepen our relationship to the Islands of the Boston Harbor.Memories of our experiences with land defines our relationship to land. What remains, today, of our relationship to the non-human; to the animal, plant, or island? Our guiding questions investigate our relationship to the Boston Harbor Islands while collecting signs of Island sentience along the way.
